



Why have the Attar, Pulpit and Baptismal Font in Hope Lutheran?

from the Pastor

At the heart of every Lutheran church, you'll find something truly sacred: the Altar, the Pulpit, and the Baptismal Font. These aren't just beautiful features; they hold deep meaning and are key to who we are as Lutherans. As the pastor at Hope Lutheran Church, I want to remind you how important the Word and Sacrament are in our worship. This message will take a closer look at these sacred elements and what they mean for us.







Inside our sanctuary, the Altar, Pulpit, and Baptismal Font are powerful symbols of our beliefs. The Altar represents Christ's sacrifice and God's presence among us. It's where we gather for Holy Communion, a reminder of the grace we receive through His sacrifice.


The Pulpit, elevated and prominent, stands for the authority of Scripture. It's where we preach the Word, an essential part of our worship. Through biblical preaching, we gain guidance and encouragement, drawing us closer to God's truth.

The Baptismal Font, positioned front and center, reminds us of our identity as baptized children of God. It encourages us to reflect on the promises made during our baptism and challenges us to live out our faith every day.

The arrangement of these sacred elements encourages us to engage and participate as a congregation. The layout invites us to move within the sanctuary, guiding us toward the Altar and Baptismal Font. This design reinforces our shared journey in faith, centered around God's grace.

As we gather around these sacred spaces, we're reminded of our call to serve each other and put our faith into action. The Word and Sacrament empower us to share the Gospel and be Christ's hands and feet in our communities.

In short, the Altar, Pulpit, and Baptismal Font are much more than physical structures; they are the essence of our Lutheran faith. They embody our beliefs, traditions, and the spirit of our community worship. When we come together at Hope Lutheran Church, let's cherish these sacred gifts, letting them shape our lives and deepen our faith.



By understanding the significance of these elements, we can truly appreciate the richness of our

Lutheran tradition and the transformative nature of the Word and Sacrament. 

FROM SALOON TO SALVATION

From the Pages of History

It's not every church that can capitalize on a barroom tradition.

Hope Lutheran Church isn't passing up the opportunity. Case in point is the theme the church is using for its new building dedicated on Rancho California Road this week, "Branching out with Hope."

That's branching as in Long Branch Saloon, an old Temecula drinking establishment of considerable stature.

The Old Town saloon went out of biz in the late 1970s. Hope Lutheran took over the building around 1980, making it the church's first permanent building.

The church left up the dancing girl murals from the old bar. The pastor at the time, Werner Welchert, preached alongside this exhibit.

"The pastor had to really hold their attention," says today's pastor, Lyle Peterson. "It was the Gospel and the girls."

Old customers from the bar occasionally dropped in on worship services looking for a drink, not a sermon.

Legend has it one hungover guy staggered in some Sunday and yelled, "Can anyone find any hope in this place." Peterson says it's one reason the church is named Hope. Good thing the drunk didn't shout out something blasphemous.

Hope Lutheran moved on to a different location after about a year and another church—apparently a tad more conservative—leased out the space and got rid of the murals. Partypoopers.

Peterson, who has been with Hope Lutheran since 1988, calls his church's colorful history: "From Saloon to Salvation."


