



"Why are you so afraid, you with little faith?" he asked, before calming the storm with just a word. And just like that, the sea was at peace again." (Matthew 8:26)

Where is our faith?

When I hear the news, I feel like one of the disciples in the boat as the storm was raging around them. In this horrific scene, the disciples were shaken to their core, and Jesus gently addressed them, "Oh, you with such little faith." I can't help but imagine the warmth in his eyes and perhaps even a playful smirk as he spoke those words. Unlike the stern tone we often see in movies, I think it was more like a gentle teasing, maybe even a light-hearted toughing up of Matthew's hair.

This moment wasn't about scolding; it was about teaching something profound. Jesus wasn't measuring their faith like a cup of sugar. When he once commented on their small faith, they eagerly asked for more, but he reminded them that even faith the size of a mustard seed could move mountains.

So, clearly, it wasn't about how much faith they had. Maybe it was about where they placed it. If their trust was in the boat to keep them safe, then they'd only feel secure when the sea was calm. But if they placed their trust in the boundless love and care of the Father, then the fury of the winds and waves wouldn't faze them.

I believe that these are stormy times but we are anchored in Christ.


HOPE'S MENS GROUP: Our next meeting is on Saturday February 15th, 2025 at 8:00 AM in the Fellowship Hall as well as on Zoom. We will continue our study of the New Testament book of Galatians. You are encouraged to read Chapter 2 as we will complete our line by line study Chapter 1 and begin the study of Chapter 2 line by line. Paul wrote to the churches he founded in Galatia (modern day Turkey), warning them against certain false teachers. Paul reminds the churches of the simple message of salvation by faith alone, which he and other church leaders teach and concludes with advice on how to live a Spirit-filled life. As we learned in our study in January, the words Paul used writing Galatians have very specific meaning and the information in Galatians is foundational to our understanding of Christianity. If you are able to read Galatians in a version different than you normally read, please consider doing so. We will study the meaning and messages in the words Paul wrote in Galatians.

Hope Hysterical History

Way back in the dark ages (1979), Hope prayed for the possible transition from temporary pastors to its first called pastor. God heard, and provided. Pastor Werner Welchert and his wife Marcella provided experience and talent. Marcella was our pianist and choir director. When Pastor Welchert's sister, Hedy Moessner, joined Hope as our pianist, Marcella continued as choir director...and secretary...and treasurer. When we were no longer welcome at the Lake Village clubhouse, it was Pastor Welchert, Roger Hageman (real estate guru), and Joan Sparkman (community everything) who paved the way for us to worship in the Longbranch Saloon which had been recently vacated. (It is now the 1909 Restaurant). Pastor Welchert also had the foresight to hire Dr. Ernst Schwidder to carve the anchor cross and altar. Those pieces have traveled with us to four different sites. The branch that Jesus is holding is the symbol of the branch of Jesse, but also to remind us of our good fortune to be able to worship in the Longbranch until our first permanent building was completed on Rancho California Road.

Recently, during Epiphany (celebration of Magi, of Jesus' baptism, and the miracle at Cana) another item of Pastor Welchert's enduring presence was put in the sanctuary. When Pastor Welchert was in high school (about 1935), he created a small, creative table that is attractive and useful. It has a special use, as it holds the Communion elements every Sunday. Blessed to be a blessing.


Hope Women's Ministry




